The next Have Your Say at the library will take place on the 18th April 2016 between 14:00-15:00. Parking issues in the area were raised as peoples main concern and it is something we are working with along with our partner agencies to help tackle.

The sunny weather is bringing more Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) to the area, so can we take the opportunity to remind householders to secure their properties if they go out, even if it's only into the garden.

The area has recently suffered a number of thefts from motor vehicles. Enquiries are ongoing and so far we have found that only one person who had items stolen from their vehicle had marked their property – making them identifiable if found. Can we remind workmen in particular, to mark your property/tools somehow! If you are concerned with using your postcode go with something simple like a reference number or blobs of paint.
